

## Watchung Stable Announces Wintertime Horse Clinics

MOUNTAINSIDE – Wintertime clinics about horses will be offered at the Watchung Stable in Mountainside beginning Sunday, January 14. Sponsored by Union County, the clinics will be held on Saturdays and Sundays through February 25.

"The sessions will help people learn simple behaviors of the horse, the evolution and history of riding and what it actually takes to own your own horse," said Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski.

People interested in these clinics should note that these are classes with no actual riding.

Patrons nine-years-old through adult are invited to register for as many clinics as they would like. Each session will last two hours, and will focus on one of a variety of topics. Classes are designed for specific riding levels and ages, with some open to all levels of expertise, including people who have never ridden before. The clinics will be held in the barn or the lecture area of the stable.

**Antinori Solaia 2001**  
Masses of coffee and blackberry character in this youthful wine. Full-bodied, with velvety tannins, loads of fruit and excellent wood. Big and juicy, with a long, long finish. A fine wine. Needs time. **\$129.99**

**Sette Ponti Toscana Oreno 2003**  
Breathtaking. Dense and powerful, with grilled meat and currant aromas and flavors. Full-bodied, round, chewy; massive and exciting. More muscular than the 2001. **\$69.99**

**Robert Craig Mt. Veeder Cabernet Sauvignon 2003**  
How big this wine got, so juicy and ripe! It's almost over the top, with all that heady black currant, blueberry, Provencal herb and new oak flavor. With power like this, control is desperately needed. At its best in 2008. **\$59.99**

**Pine Ridge Stags Leap District Cabernet Sauvignon 2002**  
The '01 was a hard act to follow. If the '02 lacks a bit of the rich opulence of its predecessor, it may be a more ageable wine. The tannins are thick yet sweet, covering ripe black currant and oaky-mocha flavors that last through an impressively long finish. Drink this dry, balanced Cab now thru 2014. **\$59.99**

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**Antinori Péppoli 2003**  
Péppoli Chianti Classico DOCG is the archetypal modern Chianti Classico. It combines the complexity and structure of a well-aged riserva with the fruity fragrance of a young wine. Intense red fruit aromas with hints of vanilla. A well-balanced wine with good structure and nice length with fruity flavours.

**Pine Ridge Dijon Clones Chardonnay 2004**  
What's so interesting about this Chardonnay is the dryness and the earthy minerality. There are flavors of dried herbs and dried fruits, such as apricots, lemons and pink grapefruits. Usually these Dijon clones produce enormously fruity wines, but this fine wine has a sleek, high-acid Chablisian elegance.

**Marchesi di Barolo 2001**  
Aromas of dried meat and ripe fruit follow through to a full-bodied palate, with a peppery, light raisin flavor. Chewy yet ripe tannins. Goes on for a long time on the palate. Very well done for the vintage.

**Catena Malbec 2004**  
Great aromas of crushed blueberry and raspberry, with a juicy texture and well-integrated toast and mineral notes. Nice blast of pure fruit on the finish. Drink now thru 2009.

**Seghesio Cortina Zinfandel 2004**  
Blueberries, blackberries, and exotic, tropical fruit characteristics appear in this deep ruby-hued wine. Dramatic, with superb purity, black and blue fruits, impressive opulence, and good underlying acidity. Will drink well for 5-6 years.

**Treana Red 2001**  
You can taste the richness here in the deeply satisfying dark stone fruit and earth complexities of plums, coffee, black cherries and spices. Very dry, full-bodied and balanced, with a firm spread of dusty tannins. Excellent now, and should develop additional complexities for several years.

**Sebastiani Sonoma County Merlot 2002**  
A great example of a coastal Merlot from a good vintage, lush and sweet in cherry, cassis and cocoa flavors, yet completely dry, and the tannins are rich and smooth. A complex velvety softness caresses the finish.

**Quinta do Crasto Douro Reserva Old Vines 2003**  
Rich red, like biting into a German chocolate cake. There's a delicate, refined element with meat, mineral, dark plum and cassis. Long, luxuriant finish of chocolate and mocha spice. Best thru 2010.

**Warre's Vintage Port 2003**  
A concentrated, backward effort, its youthful, classically ungenerous, masculine character reveals black pepper laced dark fruits. Silky-textured in its immensely endowed mid-palate, this top-flight effort displays an admirably long, tannin-filled finish. Requires serious cellaring.

**Coldisole Brunello di Montalcino 2000**  
Thick and chewy, with blackberry and tobacco character. Full-bodied, with a long finish. Really well done. Best after 2006.

**Feudi di San Gregorio Greco di Tufo 2005**  
Multi-layered lemon rind, apple, pineapple. Medium- to full-bodied, with good banana and light caramel flavors. Very long and flavorful. Drink now.

This crisp, elegant white has aromas of green apples, white peaches, and lemon zest emerging from its med.-bodied, fruity personality. With good acidity and a superb finish, this stunning 2005 will drink well for 1-2 years.

**Falesco Vitiano Rosso 2004**  
Lovely balance and clean plum, berry and chocolate character, medium body and polished tannins. The perfect house wine-a great value. Sangiovese, Merlot and Cabernet Sauv. Drink now thru 2010.

**Renwood Old Vines Zinfandel 2003**  
A nice balance of tannins, acidity and fruit, and an elegantly tailored mouthfeel. The flavors are pure Zin: Wild berries and coffee to white pepper and bitter chocolate.

**Rosenblum Petite Sirah Heritage Old Vines 2004**

Focused and elegant, with deceptive length and power, this lets lush apple, pear, fig and toast notes stretch along languidly, yet never becomes tiring to drink.

Fragrant, floral and brimming with passion fruit, guava and lime that remain zingy and elevated through the long, bracing finish. Everything you could want in a New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc. Drink now.

**Chateau Ste. Michelle Eroica Riesling 2005**
