As a whole academically, school staff will be reviewing the results of standardized tests and examining any weak areas that may need to be strengthened. In sports, Park Middle School will no longer have joint teams with Terrill Middle School for boys' and girls' soccer and basketball. Each school will instead have separate teams for both sports.
