A 'Giant' Note Caps Season for Raider Band

The Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School Raider Marching Band finished their fall competition season with a performance on November 8 at Giants Stadium in front of a crowd of 6,000. Bands from all around the tri-state area joined Scotch Plains-Fanwood in this exciting evening on the Meadowlands field.

This year's show was a compilation of Gershwin show tunes. The 130-member Raider band had a great season. The band competed in 6 festivals this fall and brought home trophies from each.

The opening competition was in Somerville, where the band achieved a score of 94.3 out of 100, placing them second overall in Music, Front Squads and Percussion categories. The next competition found the Raiders in Edison at J.P.

Stevens High School, earning the second-place trophy in Class IV for Best Music. At Hunterdon Central High, the marching band again won second place in their class, and took second place overall. Students and parents cheered as the Raiders brought home the first-place trophy in their class at South Plainfield, as well as Best Music, Front Squads and Percussion.

One of the most exciting performances of the season took place at the Bloomfield High School competition in early November. The Raiders took first place overall, Best Drum Majors, Best Music, Best Front Squads and Best Percussion. This great band had a great year. The band will now prepare for its year-end evaluation trip to the Festivals of Music in Virginia Beach, Virginia in May.

After being jammed for a loss by a jugged Glen Rock team, the Scotch Plains-Fanwood Jazz under-10 girls played "A String of Pearls," as they strung together three beautiful shutout victories to earn second place in the Rahway Fall Soccer Festival.

Exhibiting the essence of good teamwork, eight different Jazz players scored throughout the two-day post-Thanksgiving tournament; however, it was the defense that really excelled counting off 150 straight minutes of shutout soccer.
