Signups Begin for Drawing Course at Workshop for Arts

The New Jersey Workshop for the Arts is inviting young art enthusiasts in grades 4 through 6 to enroll in a drawing workshop to enhance their creativity, ability and talent.

The 10-week session, which begins on Wednesday, January 7, will be held on Wednesdays from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. and includes all necessary supplies for the \$100 enrollment fee.

Over the course of the session, veteran art instructor Diane Burkam will provide students with an opportunity to learn and practice techniques for drawing figures, portraits, and still life using a variety of mediums, including pencil, charcoal and pastels.

Special emphasis will be placed on light and shading to create three-dimensional effects.

According to Ms. Burkam, the only prerequisite for the class is that children possess "a readiness to begin, and genuinely have an interest in developing their drawing skills."

Ms. Burkam has taught elementary and high school art classes in the

Brick Township school district for 13 years. She was instrumental in the development of the Kids "N" Arts class at the New Jersey Workshop for the Arts, where she coordinates art, drama, and music for preschool children ages 3 through 5, and has also devoted her time and skills teaching at the Westfield Summer Workshop for the past six years.

"I enjoy motivating the children," she said.

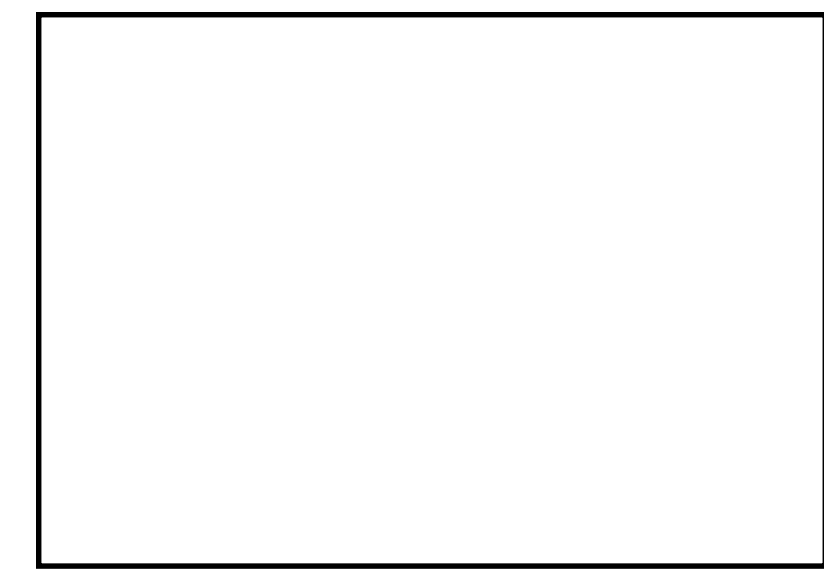
