The purpose of the Ordinance: The Township Council of Scotch Plains has determined that a binding referendum is appropriate at the next General Election in which the public shall consider whether the Township of Scotch Plains should be authorized to administer a program and purchase and acquire lands for conservation as Open Space in accordance with the authorization contained in N.J.S.A. 40:12-15.7 et seq; and for that purpose the Township Council of the Township of Scotch Plains has approved the content of the referendum question and interpretative statements to appear on the ballot.

A public hearing will be held on Tuesday, August 17, 1999, at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, or any time and place to which a meeting for the further consideration of such ordinance shall from time to time be adjourned, and all persons interested will be given an opportunity to be heard concerning such ordinance.
