Looking at what his team could offer, Leonardi did, however, point out, "We have a tremendous amount of potential. We are big. It is the biggest team that I've ever had. Whether we reach that potential, it's up to them.

Last year, the very physical Jenerette cleared out the area underneath the boards and was a major rebounder. Referring to Jenerette, Leonardi said, "I expect a lot of rebounds and a lot of points from him. I want him to stay motivated. Coming off a great football season that he had, hopefully he will be."

The half court zone style of defense will be a switch from last year when the Raiders did have more team speed with Bennie Martinez and James Allen Osborne. Both were proficient in scoring and stealing the ball.

With their absence, "We are going to have to play a half court game both

defensively and offensively," suggested Leonardi. "We don't have the quickness we had last year. Martinez is giving it all to Montclair State right now. We need to pass the ball better. We need to rebound better and probably a better job of boxing out. And we need to be more patient offensively."

Whether the Raiders realize it, then take advantage of their potential, time will tell.
