GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 1736 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD CHAPTER 13, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" BY AMENDING SECTION 13-23, "FIFTEEN MINUTE ZONES-METERED AND UNMETERED"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield in the County of Union that the Code of the Town of Westfield, Chapter 13, "Motor Vehicles and Traffic" be amended as follows:
SECTION I.
That Section 13-23 "Fifteen Minute Zones-Unmetered and Metered" be amended by adding:
a. Unmetered
Kimball Avenue. South Side, between Baker Avenue and Linden Avenue, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.; and 2:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m.
SECTION II.
All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any part of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or inconsistent.
SECTION III.
In the event that any section, part or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof that the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD, CHAPTER 13, MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, SECTION 21.1 BY ADDING LANGUAGE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield in the County of Union as follows:
SECTION I.
Section 13-21.1, "On-street parking of buses, trucks or trailers from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m." be amended by changing the title of the section to read "On-street parking of buses, trucks or trailers" and by modifying the existing language to read in its entirety as follows:
"Section 13-21.1 No person shall park any truck, bus or trailer in or upon any street within the town between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. and, in addition, no person shall park any truck, bus or trailer in or upon any street within a residential zone within the town between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. unless such truck, bus or trailer is in active use at the residential site. A truck for purposes of this ordinance shall be not less than 6,000 pounds with a commercial license. For purposes of this Ordinance, active use in the case of trucks and trailers shall mean there are workmen at the residential site who need the truck or trailer for transportation or to hold supplies that are needed for work being done at the residential site. Active use for a bus shall mean the bus has brought people to the residential site and is waiting to take them from the residential site when the activity they are attending is concluded."
SECTION II.
All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent, with any part of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or inconsistent.
SECTION III.
In the event that any section, part or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.
SECTION IV.
This ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication as soon as and in the manner provided by law.
