## Rachel Laskow Receives Association Scholarship

WESTFIELD - The Westfield Association of Administrators and Supervisors (WAS) has named Rachel L. Laskow, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jeffrey Kavalin, as the recipient of the association's annual scholarship. Rachel will be presented with the scholarship at the high school's Awards Night on June 3.

The WAS, which is comprised of administrators, supervisors and department heads in the Westfield Public Schools, establishes a scholarship committee each year to determine the recipient of the award, which carries a \$1,000 cash prize.

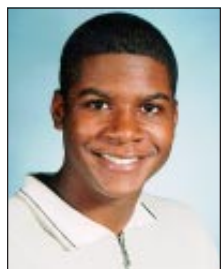

## Area Scholarship Foundation Honors Award Recipients

SCOTCH PLAINS - The Scotch Plains-Fanwood Scholarship Foundation, established on June 6, 1966, celebrated 33 years of continuous scholarship assistance on June 11 in the Leas Hall of All Saints' Episcopal Church in Scotch Plains.

This year, the 15 members of the Board of Trustees presented 83 scholarships, totaling \$82,900, to both high school and college students.

Foundation President Ellie Kramps announced that throughout its history of service to young people, the Foundation has made available 1,036 scholarships with a total value of \$790,370.

The Foundation is currently managing the moneys and doing the administrative work for 22 funds in addition to its own, as well as handling the administrative work for 17 established flow-through funds.

This year, a committee of 14 members representing eight local schools, as well as the Fanwood-Scotch Plains Service League and the Foundation, evaluated a record total of 114 applications.

The applicants were awarded scholarships based on academic achievement, extracurricular and community activities and future potential, as well as their individual need for financial assistance in procuring a college education as stipulated in the requirements for the awarding of particular scholarships.

The Foundation presented 17 Dollars for Students awards, totaling \$18,000, which was received from the community through an annual mailing and from solicitations from the annual Dollars for Students Days.

Recipients included: Joana Alonzo, Elise Daniledes, Christine Doyle, Amanda Koscielicki, Andrea Liss, Lauren Mangione, Kari Whitley, Regina Giordano, Jamie Langevin, Vaneisha Paynter, Erin Zupkus and Maureen Zupkus.

Ryan Kelly received the Alumni funded award. Jonathan Winkler was given an award named for John Lawson; Keith Oatis received an award named for Henry Schweiring; Lucy Zhao received an award named for Camille Flathmann, and Celeste Coleman was the recipient of an award named for Muriel Ramsden.
