second in scoring with 152 points and led the Raiders with 181 rebounds, 106 offensively and 75 defensively. She hit 36-70 from the foul line for 51 percent and set up 29 assists. Feighner's most impressive game offensively was when she fired in 18 to help burn Westfield. She also swiped 22 steals.

Senior Jeannie McCoy scored 136 points and was second in free throw percentage at .61, sinking 36-59. She led the Raiders in assists with 60 and was second in steals with 71. McCoy also grabbed 54 offensive and 49 defensive for 103 rebounds.

Senior Krista Hicks struck for 102 points and hit 16-34 from the foul line. She also had 37 defensive and 37 offensive rebounds for a 74 total and had 27 steals. Senior Christine Bowers finished with 68 points, 39 assists and was third with 47 steals. Bowers also yanked down 39 defensive and 26 offensive rebounds for a total of 65.

Glover hit for 87 points and sank 21-45 from the foul line. She had 24 assists, 36 steals and pulled in 29 defensive and 15 offensive rebounds, totaling 44. Freshman Kellie LaForge saw some playing time and contributed 18 points, 20 rebounds, seven assists and nine steals.

Kourtney Gray had eight points, six assists, eight rebounds and five steals. Erin Gilolly had eight points and six rebounds, Katie Blom had four points, one rebound and two steals and Megan Mele contributed two points, one rebound and one steal.

Both McCoy's, Hicks and Bowers will be lost to graduation. Next year, Feighner and Glover will bear the responsibility of leading the Raiders.
