In a double header at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School on March 25, the extreme competitiveness of this year's league play was highly evident, as the teams challenged each other all night on the court.

The Renegades remained undefeated, pulling away from the De-fence squad to register their fourth win, behind a strong effort on the boards by Charles

Turner and Greg Smith. A two-point halftime lead grew in the second half as the winners received balanced scoring from the guards, especially Bill McLoughlin. De-Fence was paced by Westfield's Spud Monroe and Sean Murray.

In the second game, equally spirited, the tall International Realty squad, led by 6'8" Brian Hill, hit their foul shots at the end of a squeaker, and pulled away from Mercedes of Morristown.

In games on March 2, at Terrill, Merrill Lynch easily defeated International Realty, 56-34. Rich Conrad led the victors' balanced scoring with 13, prompting one observer to call him "the man in the league." The Renegades put on another explosive display, crushing Mercedes by 32 points. Four double-figure scorers for the Renegades were Jeff Cove, with 16, Steve Shepard 15, Charles Turner 14 and big Greg Smith with 10.

In the finale, a competitive effort by Big Sky brought the new entry close to a victory, but two points shy. Warren pulled away from a ball game that was close throughout, with a daring drive down the lane by Jerrold Zeitelz for a hoop with only 25 seconds left, which ultimately was the difference. Big Greg Carney led the Warriors with 13.

# SP-F High School Announces Second Period Honor Roll

Two hundred fifty-six students have been named to the second marking period Honor Roll at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School.

Nine freshmen, or 3.26 percent of the 276-member class, were named to the High Honor Roll, which requires straight "A's" if the student is taking four or five subjects, or at least five "A's" and a maximum of one "B."

Forty students, or 14.49 percent of the class, made the Honor Roll, which requires no mark less than a "B" and at least three "A's."

## GENERAL ORDINANCE NO.

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Westfield, County of Union, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

### SECTION 1.

**Short Title**  
An ordinance banning the use of government buildings and government equipment for political fundraising.

### SECTION 2.

**Purpose**  
**WHEREAS**, our laws in New Jersey do not presently ban solicitation or acceptance of contributions by public office holders and employees while on public property or by use of public facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, a conflict may arise between the business of political fundraising and the business of government in town hall and other government owned premises, and this may cause a distraction from the People's business; and

**WHEREAS**, the most appropriate method to prevent this conflict and to insure the integrity of government decisions is the prohibition of political fundraising on or by use of public property;

**THEREFORE**, it is accordingly found and determined that the paramount public interest in a clean and accountable government requires the prohibition of political fundraising on public property or by use of public facilities.

### SECTION 3.

**Definitions.**  
A. Candidate - Any individual seeking election to a public office of the federal government, state, county, municipality, school district or political organization at an election.

B. Contribution - Includes all loans and transfers of money or other thing of value to or by any candidate, elected official or political organization and all pledges or other commitments or assumptions of liability to make any such transfer. Contributions shall be deemed to have been made upon the date when such commitment is made or liability assumed.

C. Political Organization - Means any two or more persons acting jointly, or any corporation, partnership or any other incorporated or unincorporated association which is organized to, or does, aid or promote the nomination, election or defeat of any candidate or candidates for federal, state, county, municipal or school board office. "Political organization" includes, but is not limited to, organizations otherwise defined as "political committee," "joint candidates committee," and "legislative leadership committee."

D. Municipality - This municipality and any officer, department, board, commission, or agency thereof.

E. Municipal official, employee and appointee - Any person holding elective municipal office or holding an appointed position in the municipal government, or in any agency, commission, board, or office thereof, whether the position is full time or part time, compensated or uncompensated; and any employee of municipal government or in any agency, commission, board, or office thereof, whether the position is full time or

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that said contract shall incorporate the potential gross savings to the Township over the lifetime of the contract from the deregulated procurement and competitive acquisition of natural gas and electric commodities, and the management fees charged by NUI Energy Solutions, Inc.; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the passage of this Resolution and entering into a subsequent contract shall in no way prevent the Township Council of Scotch Plains from rescinding this Resolution if it turns out that greater benefits to the Township and its citizens could be realized from another alternative under the recently passed natural gas and energy deregulation law.

Certification and availability of funds for this service is subject to final adoption and passage of the 1999 Municipal Budget.
