

FINDLAY GRABS 3 INTS, MILLER NAILS 24 YD FG

'Red Hot' Red Devils Burn G. L. Highlanders, 14-5

Continued strong defensive play by the Governor Livingston Highlanders was not sufficient enough to overpower the Ridge Red Devils in Berkeley Heights on October 16. G. L.'s offense managed just one score in the third quarter via K. C. Miller's 16-yard field goal earning Ridge a 14-5 victory.
