Over the past 28 years, Mrs. Boothe was very active as a cheerleader coach, an advisor to Student Council, Future Teachers Club and Young Republican Club; a member of the Intermediate Planning and Instructional Grouping Committees; a representative for the Math Department in the Parent-Teacher Organization, and as an officer for the Westfield Education Association.

## Miller-Cory House Prepares For Historic Tour Weekend

WESTFIELD — The Miller-Cory House Museum, located at 614 Mountain Avenue, Westfield, will be featured on a free two-day fall tour of 22 Union County historical sites.

For "Four Centuries Weekend," the Miller-Cory House will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, October 23, and from noon to 5 p.m. on Sunday, October 24.

The Museum will conduct tours of the house and gardens along with demonstrations of 18th century cooking.

Built in 1740, the Miller-Cory House Museum stands on the "road to the mountains" in Westfield. The Miller-Cory House was named in honor of its two pre-Revolutionary owners, both descended from the earliest settlers in this area.

Today, the Museum is a nationally-

recognized living museum. It has been certified as an historic site and has been entered on both the State and National Registers of Historic Places.

Visitors are introduced to a variety of Colonial skills as trained artisans and costumed docents recreate the everyday life, the crafts and tasks of the 18th and early 19th century farm family in Westfield.

On Sunday, October 31, from 2-5 p.m., the Museum will resume its weekly program schedule and feature "Final Respects," a program on 18th century funeral customs, as well as open-hearth cooking.
